

Your dentist has asked us to examine you to see if **orthodontic treatment** can help make your teeth straighter and your bite work more efficiently. This leaflet tells you a little about the practice but please consult our website for more information.

What can orthodontics do for you?

- Enhance your smile and help to strengthen your self-confidence.
- Create a beautiful smile.
- Improve the overall oral health of the teeth.
- Achieve balance and harmony of the teeth, jaws and facial features.
- Make teeth easier to keep clean, reducing the possibility of dental decay and gum.
- Make the bite distribute the chewing forces more evenly on the teeth and the supporting structures, which can improve your ability to chew and speak.

Orthodontics for Children and Adolescents

- Your dentist will advise you if your child needs orthodontic treatment.
- If you are concerned about the position of your teeth speak to your dentist.
- Treatment normally starts when most of the adult teeth have erupted.
- NHS treatment is available but only if your bite is bad enough to qualify.

The psychological and social implications of orthodontics are beneficial, giving teenagers the confidence to express themselves and interact in a positive manner.



Treatment available

- Screening and advice about the developing teeth and the way they bite in children
- Occasionally early treatment for children, who still have some primary teeth, if this is going to benefit them later.
- Full orthodontic treatment using a variety of fixed and removable braces for adolescents and adults.
- Combined treatment, with your own dentist or another specialist, if you require bridges, veneers, implants or other surgical procedures as well as orthodontics.
- You must be a regular attender with a General Dentist to receive treatment here.
- NHS treatment is available if you qualify.
- Private treatment is available for Adults and Children

Your first visit

- Please arrive **10 minutes** early to complete the paperwork and bring your health questionnaire.
- The ORTHODONTIST will discuss your concerns. The treatment we offer will address these and any other problems there may be with your teeth and bite.
- Your teeth and mouth will be examined and records taken. These include impressions (moulds of your teeth), X-rays and photographs.
- **PLEASE REMOVE ALL METAL JEWELLERY, STUDS AND HAIR CLIPS PRIOR TO YOUR VISIT TO ALLOW X-RAYS TO BE TAKEN.**
- The orthodontist will discuss the findings with you and make a plan to deal with these.
- No treatment will be provided at the first visit, it is simply an examination.
- After completing this visit you will either be advised to start treatment or to wait until more teeth grow and see how your bite develops.
- A letter will be sent to your dentist advising them of the results from this visit. You must continue to visit your dentist while you attend here as well.

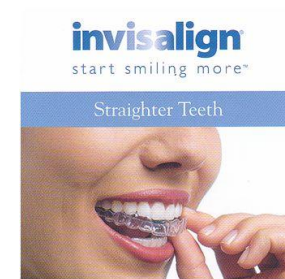


Options for treatment

- **National Health Service**
 - Appointments WILL be during school hours
 - Treatment is performed using either removable appliances or metal fixed appliances (shown above).
 - You will be assessed to see if you qualify for NHS treatment
 - Mild problems no longer qualify for NHS treatment
- **Private Treatment**
 - Adults and Children
 - No waiting list
 - More flexibility with appointment times
 - More time – at each appointment to ensure the smoothest possible treatment efficiency
